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Subject: TPHS-DTDIHEY Case#SO260342 Supplemental Proof of Structural Collusion, Institutional Conflict, and Intentional Database Manipulation

INVESTIGATIVE SUMMARY

This memorandum is formally submitted to append critical structural, historical, and personnel context to the active investigation into the Jackson Parish Sheriff's Office (JPSO) database spoliation, specifically the documented 21-day case-file delay and selective face sheet scrubbing executed under Case File SO260342.

The information detailed below maps an entrenched, cross-agency political network spanning Jackson and Bienville parishes. This network operates to insulate local public officials from statutory compliance and external oversight, directly establishing the criminal intent and motive behind the server manipulation documented on the native JPSO Audit Trail from May 2026.

1. THE HISTORICAL PERSONNEL NEXUS: THERESA BURRIS.

- Current Position: Theresa Burris currently serves as the Executive Administrative Assistant to Sheriff Brent Barnett, positioned at the absolute central gateway of JPSO's executive correspondence, data streams, and administrative records.
- Prior Felony Record: In 2014, Burris was arrested by the Louisiana Office of State Inspector General and subsequently convicted of Felony Theft and Malfeasance in Office for altering municipal checks and diverting nearly \$50,000 in public funds while serving as an Arcadia municipal clerk. She was sentenced to and served an active one-year prison sentence.
- Institutional Shielding: JPSO command staff retained Burris in 2016, permitting her to fulfill her active prison term while on administrative leave, and immediately restored her to the executive suite upon release. This structural positioning of a convicted public-records felon at the core of a law enforcement agency's data infrastructure creates a continuous, systemic risk of records manipulation.

2. THE PROSECUTORIAL CO-SIGN AND INTER-AGENCY REPROACH [1.31]

- The Core Conflict: District Attorney Danny Newell is the exact prosecutor who investigated, convicted, and secured the felony sentence against Theresa Burris for public servant theft and malfeasance.
- Daily Interaction: Despite executing her criminal conviction, District Attorney Danny Newell has continued to interface and deal directly with the Sheriff's executive administrative office on a near-daily basis for years, with full and absolute knowledge that he was actively conducting official judicial business through a convicted public-records felon he personally prosecuted.
- The Collapse of Oversight: This long-term administrative arrangement documents a complete breakdown of mandatory constitutional boundaries and Brady-compliance oversight between the District Attorney's office and JPSO headquarters. It establishes that the local prosecution track is a compromised party, actively participating in the normalization of compromised records personnel within the executive suite.

3. THE EXPLICIT MOTIVE FOR SERVER SPOILIATION

This deep historical and prosecutorial crossover provides the definitive answer to the core question of motive: why JPSO command staff executed a 21-day database hold on Detective Walker's files and utilized records terminal JP-53 (Lindsey Stevenson) to selectively scrub notarized affidavits from the public records export on May 19.

The targets panicked because my persistent public records tracking threatened to force a mandatory legal recusal under the Color of Law statutes. Bringing in an uncompromised outside agency, such as the State Police, would have instantly exposed that the District Attorney and the Sheriff were operating an active data hub run by a convicted public-service records thief. They manipulated the server logs specifically to keep this broader, cross-agency network hidden in the dark.

CONCLUSION AND FILE SECURITY

A complete mirror copy of this historical overview, alongside the native 11-page JPSO server audit trail, has been securely archived outside of parish lines and logged directly into active federal tracking repositories under U.S. DOJ Civil Rights Record #816168-DWZ.

I request that state forensic investigators integrate this multi-agency organizational chart into their preparation for the upcoming field interview phase to ensure that local administrative transitions cannot be weaponized to evade criminal accountability.
